Transition signals

- Transition signals '**signal**' relationships between sentences, or between paragraphs.
- □ They can be a single word (**therefore**) or a phrase (**on the contrary**)
- □ Different kinds of transition signals:
 - A. Subordinators
 - **B.** Coordinators
 - C. Prepositions

How do you signal to a reader:

- □ An example: *for example*
- □ A similar idea: *similarly*
- □ An opposite idea: *in contrast*
- □ A result: *therefore*
- □ A conclusion: in conclusion

- Coordinators combine two or more independent clauses that have equal importance.
 - The report proves that parents have a great influence upon children's language development and the influences are most of the time positive.
- Subordinators link a main clause and a dependent or subordinate clause.
 - He plans to find a job in the medical field as soon as he finishes his practicum.
