Prepositions

What is it?

 A preposition links nouns, pronouns, and phrases to other words in a sentence.

 The word or phrase that the preposition introduces is called the object of the preposition.

Creates a relationship between words.



Prepositions for time: in, on, at

- Warren was born in 1942.
- Sarah was born <u>on</u> July 26, 1987.
- The president will deliver a speech from the White House to the nation <u>on</u>Independence Day <u>at</u> 7 PM, EDT.
- I will call you <u>at</u> 3 PM.

Place

Preposition for place: (in, on, at)

- Peter lives <u>in</u> Taipei, Taiwan.
- Emily's apartment is on the corner of Third and Main.
- Amy wrote a sentence on the blackboard.
- Stella's house is <u>at</u> the end of Elm Street.

Direction

Preposition for direction: to, toward, through, into

- She went <u>to</u> the library to finish her report.
- He jumped <u>into</u> the river to avoid the swarm of bees.
- He ran away in the opposite when he saw the herd of gazelle barreling <u>towards</u> him.
- I lost sight of the train as soon as it went <u>through</u> the tunnel.

Agent

- Preposition for agent: by, with
 - This book is written by Charles Dickens.
 - The bathtub is filled <u>with</u> soapy water.

Device/Instrument/Machine

- Preposition for machinery, instrument, or devices: by, with
 - She goes to school <u>by</u> bus everyday.
 - He opened the safe <u>with</u> a key, revealing the stacks of cash inside.

Special Situations

- Same subject, different preposition
 - Johnny goes to school everyday <u>on</u> foot.
 - Sally goes to school everyday by car.

• Are you going to pay <u>in</u> cash or <u>by</u> card?
